- **5. Learning Leaders Information Session:** Cindy Brock, a Learning Leader from Student Services spoke about registration and course selection.
  - Student Services provided emotional and academic support for students. Student can access
    via referral or walk-in. Extensive Wrap-Around support offered with the following services and
    supports:
    - o IPP development and exam accommodations when required
    - o "Credit-rescue" for students requiring support to pass their courses.
    - "Grad Check-ins" are provided to help students graduate on time; also support with grad ceremony planning
    - o Post-secondary and career planning
    - o Grade 7-9 registration for Bridges for Foundation

#### **6. Principal's message** - Clare Haney:

Power School Breach - January 7 th CBE was advised of a Power School cybersecurity incident
that occurred on December 28 th . CBE immediately limited third party access to Power School
and is working to determine the extent of the impact and next steps. Power School has assured
CBE that the incident is contained and that they have taken the necessary steps. CBE has put an
FAQ on the public and staff facing web sites.

- Exams Last day of classes for high school students was on Friday Jan. 10 th . Diploma and gr. 10 & mp; 11 exams are occurring until Jan. 27 th . Junior High classes are running as usual.
- Semester 2/Term 3 begins on January 28 th .
- Schools will receive their enrollment projections on February 10 th this number is used to along with the student course requests to determine how many sections of each course will be offered and staffing priorities.
- Next Year Registration Assistant Principals and Student Services will be visiting all grade 9 classes the week of March 3 rd -7 th to talk about High School course selection. Assemblies will be held for gr. 10 and 11 students. The Power School registration portal will open on March 7 th so students and parents can go in and request courses.
